

Johor masterplan on display to gather feedback

JOHOR BARU: The public can view development plans for the Straits of Johor over a period of two weeks at the Johor Baru City Council (MBJB).

The Johor Straits Development Research Corridor Masterplan 2025 public display will provide more

insight into research being conducted by the State Economic Planning Unit (UPEN).

MBJB mayor Datuk Abdul Rahman Mohamed Dewam said the public display would gather feedback on the current project as well as upcoming developments at

reclamation areas along the Tebrau and Johor straits.

“The documents will be displayed at the council’s Planning Department from Aug 5 to 19 for viewing during office hours,” he said at the full board meeting here.

Abdul Rahman said the research

areas cover waters near the border facing Singapore starting from the Tanjung Langsat up to Pasir Gudang ports.

He added that the masterplan also involves four local councils – MBJB, Johor Baru Central Municipal Council, Pasir Gudang

Municipal Council and Pontian District Council.

It can also be viewed at the three local councils, state government housing secretary office as well as at the Iskandar Regional Development Authority (IRDA) office during the same time period.
